Activity



Making a Christingle

Christingle is a celebratory event that takes place in thousands of churches and schools across the UK. Develop children's knowledge and understanding of the world and awareness of cultures with this festive activity.

Learning aims

- Physical development
- Creativity
- Personal, social and emotional development
- Keeping safe
- Developing respect for others
- Awareness of own and other cultures.



Resources

For each Christingle you will need:

- An orange (the world)
- A candle (the light of the world)
- Sheet of foil cut into small squares about 75mm (3")
- Red ribbon/tape (love wrapped around the world)
- Four cocktail sticks
- Selection of dried fruit/mini marshmallows (God's creations or the four seasons)
- Pair of scissors.

Activity outline

- Make sure adults supervise children throughout the making of their Christingles
- Encourage children to wash their hands first
- Let each child choose an orange. Support them to fasten a piece of red sticky tape/ribbon around the middle
- Cut a small cross in the top of the orange. For health and safety reasons, remember to discuss the danger of sharp knives with the children
- Support children to lay a square of silver foil over the cut
- Help children place a candle on top of the foil and wedge it firmly into the orange
- Support the children to thread the dried fruit/mini marshmallows onto the cocktail sticks so that the tips are covered
- Assist children to insert the sticks around the base of the candle
- Store your Christingles upright in a cool place. Don't make them too far in advance as they don't keep for very long
- The highlight of most Christingle celebrations usually involves the lighting of the Christingle candles under dimmed lights.



Special considerations

- Be aware of children with allergies e.g. oranges. Ensure they can take part in the activity by replacing the orange with another fruit
- Be considerate of children of other faiths and non.
